

Eastern Virginia Medical Campus Walking Tour

Jones Institute (H5) Named for the married couple Howard Jones, MD, and Georgeanna Jones, MD, who pioneered in vitro fertilization in the United States, the Jones Institute is where the first IVF baby in the U.S. was conceived in 1981. The institute continues to have an active research staff, along with a clinical practice. The building also houses staff members of Contraceptive Research and Development (CONRAD). CONRAD works with researchers worldwide to develop contraceptives and methods to prevent the spread of sexually transmitted diseases, particularly in developing countries. CONRAD is headquartered in Northern Virginia.

Lewis Hall and EVMS Bookstore (G4) Lewis Hall is used for basic science research and education purposes. Lewis Hall is also home to the anatomy lab, the CAST Center, and the Art Therapy studio, which is open 24/7. Coffee, snacks and boxed lunches are available at the bookstore. You can also find the Hampton Roads Community Foundation Student Center, Student Affairs, Financial Aid, the Network Center for IT support, Roper and McCombs auditoriums, study rooms, student mailboxes and lockers. Lewis Hall is named for philanthropists Sydney and Frances Lewis, who provided a key gift in support of the school.

Andrews Hall (F6) This building houses EVMS' Student Health Clinic, Occupational Health, two clinical departments, Dermatology and Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, as well as EVMS Development and Alumni Relations. It also houses the new EVMS Lawrence J. Goldrich Institute for Integrated NeuroHealth, made possible through a \$15 million gift from Lawrence and Janice Goldrich. The building is named for two physician brothers, Mason Andrews, MD, and William Andrews, MD, who were instrumental in establishing EVMS.

Waitzer Hall (E8) Named for a generous gift from The Leah and Richard Waitzer Foundation, this is the newest building on campus and is now fully operational. It has two sections: the three-story podium and the tower. The podium holds the new student-testing center, state-of-the-art classrooms, student common and study areas, and a student wellness center. The tower houses senior administration and school leadership, administrative offices such as Financial Services, Graduate Medical Education, Continuing Medical Education, Marketing and Communications, and Human Resources, as well as a parking garage.

South Campus (B8, B9, C8) Located across Brambleton Avenue is an area known as South Campus. South

Campus includes EVMS' Materials Management, Norfolk Public Health Department and Williams Hall, home of the EVMS Strelitz Diabetes Center and the school's pediatric research unit.

Fort Norfolk Plaza (A7) This private office building is home to the EVMS Sleep Center.

Hofheimer Hall (D6) This is EVMS' principal clinical facility on campus, housing the practices of Family and Community Medicine, Internal Medicine, Glennan Center for Geriatrics and Gerontology, OB/GYN, Maternal-Fetal Medicine, Surgery, Infectious Disease, Urogynecology and Psychiatry. It is named for Henry Clay and Elise Hofheimer, early supporters of the school.

Sentara Norfolk General Hospital (D5) EVMS partners with several hospitals in the region, including Sentara Norfolk General Hospital, for resident training and clinical rotations. Sentara Norfolk General includes the region's only Level 1 trauma center, which is staffed by EVMS trauma surgeons. The hospital just completed a major expansion and modernization project.

Sentara Heart Hospital (C2) Sentara Heart Hospital consistently ranks among the nation's top heart programs in U.S. News & World Report. As a dedicated heart hospital, it has 112 inpatient beds and 45 pre- and post-procedural rooms for outpatient heart procedures. EVMS pulmonary and critical care fellows rotate through the Cardiac Intensive Care Unit.

Children's Hospital of The King's Daughters (F4)

CHKD is a vital teaching affiliate of EVMS, and CHKD pediatricians make up the teaching faculty of EVMS Pediatrics. CHKD houses the region's only Level 1 pediatric trauma center and is building a children's mental health hospital on campus set to open in 2022.

Brickell Medical Sciences Library (G4) Distinguishable by The Beazley Foundation Rotunda, Brickell Medical Sciences Library was named for former EVMS President Edward E. Brickell. The library is open and accessible to students 24/7, and it extends many services to the Hampton Roads community. The student computer lab is housed here.

Lester Hall and TowneBank Lawn (H3, G3)

Lester Hall is named for former EVMS President Harry T. Lester, who retired in 2013. The building is home to the School of Health Professions, Leroy T. Canoles Jr. Cancer Research Center, Sentara Center for Simulation & Immersive Learning, lab space and the standardized patient program.
